Role Title:

Volunteer Co-trainer.

Location:

Disability Equality North West offices, 103 – 104 Church Street, Preston and others from time to time.

Hours:

Various.

Purpose:

To support the Safety First Team to deliver training to partner agencies.

The topics covered are likely to be:

- Hate Crime Awareness.
- Mate Crime Awareness.
- Social Model of Disability.
- Personal Safety for Disabled People.

Position in Organisation:

Reporting to the Safety First Project Manager and close working with the Safety First Team.

Key personal attributes required:

- Comfortable talking to groups of people.
- Good understanding of the training topics covered.
- Understanding of group dynamics.
- Excellent communication and people skills.
- Professional, polite and respectful.
- Reliable and confidential.
- Knowledge of the lived experiences of disabled people.
- Ability to travel to training locations.

Main Duties are to:

- To deliver training to different groups in various settings e.g. partner agencies and community groups
- To demonstrate a good understanding of the training subjects.
- To contribute to the training sessions and any information e.g. presentations, handouts etc.
- Understand safeguarding and data protection principles.
- Understand confidentiality and boundary issues.

Other general activities:

- Undertake other tasks as allocated.
- Participate in required training.
- Attend relevant volunteer meetings with project staff to review the volunteer role.
- Maintain professional boundaries at all times.
- Follow all Disability Equality North West policy and procedures.

Induction Training:

- Introduction to Disability Equality North West and the Safety First project.
- The Social Model of Disability.
- Hate Crime Awareness.

Other Requirements:

- Two references (from non-family members).
- An enhanced Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) clearance.
